OHIO DEPARTMENT OF 216-787-3498 JOB AND FAMILY SERVICES

East 18th Street and Prospect Avenue

Offers employment testing, counseling and assistance with job search and placement services. In addition, free walk-in access to the Internet for job-seeking purposes is available. Veterans' specialists are also available. If you should lose your job, you may qualify for unemployment benefits.

Administers federal and state programs which assist Ohio Works First participants to achieve employment and self-sufficiency. Includes job search, education, job training, placement services and assistance with child care and transportation.
